
The Blood Bank is located at 4335 18th Avenue, Rock Island.

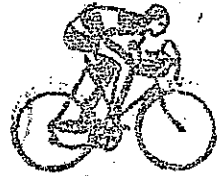
