# Bike Trail Damage

It's the same old saying - you don't appreciate something until it's gone. That's the feeling that came over me as I walked along the bike path in Davenport and Bettendorf following the recent devasting flooding. As I looked at the tremendous amount of debris, toppled trees, and sand packed trail, I couldn't believe the mess Duck Creek left behind!

According to Ed Schick, of the City of Bettendorf, the 3.1 miles of trail in Bettendorf sustained around \$92,000 in damage and clean up costs, with 500 feet of actual trail damaged. Roger Murray, of the City of Davenport gave me an estimate of \$55,000 in damages. Murray estimates 620 feet of trail that will need replacing or repair.

At the time of this writing no definite plans for organizing volunteers for clean-up have been announced. However, if you would like to know if you can help in anyway, call 326-7812 (Davenport) or 359-1651 (Bettendorf)

Both cities did a tremendous job of getting the trail back in use, but there appears to still be a tremendous amount of clean up needed.







# Griff's Ramblings


August just sounds hot, doesn't it I don't know if it will be or not; I'm writing this mid-July, and the high today was in the lower 70s. And, yes, it is raining.



I hope some of you who think all riders are 50 plus milers at 20 mph will join us on future rides.



At 6:30 p.m. that evening, we will meet on the St. Louis riverfront to board the sternwheelers Tom Sawyer and the Huckleberry Finn (that's right, there are two boats) on which we will cruise while enjoying a fine dinner along with live entertainment, and finish off with a race to the landing with paddles flying and whistles blowing. Then back to the motels for a good night's rest so that we can rise in the morning for the variety of rides available.


